


2014 Rural Roundup To Be Held In Pony Express Territory

The 24th Annual Tourism Conference will take place in Ely on April 30-May 2.

Rural Roundup, April 30 through May 2, is sponsored by the Nevada Commission on Tourism, part of the Nevada Department of Tourism and Cultural Affairs. Now in its 24th year, Rural Roundup changes location annually to highlight a different rural community. This year, the conference will showcase Ely, Nevada. The schedule of events includes an East Ely Railroad Depot Museum tour, home of the [Nevada Northern Railway](#), and [Great Basin National Park](#) tour, home of the tallest mountain in the Great Basin-13,063-foot Wheeler Peak - and the stunning Lehman Caves.



Grimes Point near Fallon, Nevada.



Just 15 miles east of Fallon, are the archaeological sites Grimes Point and Hidden Cave. For a look into the region's prehistoric past, visitors can walk the path through

Cave. For a look into the region's prehistoric past, visitors can walk the path through Grimes Point and view rocky areas covered with ancient American Indian petroglyphs (rock art). [Grimes Point](#) is one of the largest and most accessible petroglyph sites in the United States. Hidden Cave is 150 feet deep and about 200 feet wide. Guided expeditions to the [Hidden Cave](#) site are sponsored by The Churchill County Museum and the Bureau of Land Management.
